It took a few days to reach the Nacho boy for an interview and the only comment that he gave was he wanted to offer an apology to his partner, his opponents and the league for his actions.

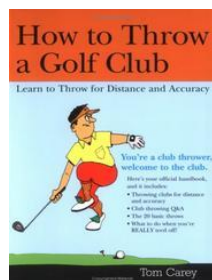

## A Year Ago ....
